## Welcome to Week 2 of your Back On Track literacy programme!

This programme is for students between Year 1 and Year 2. It reinforces the learning from Year 1 and provides the essential skills your child needs to transition successfully into Year 2.

Over 10 weeks, your child will have the opportunity to engage in fun-filled, online learning activities, based on the **Fast Phonics** programme. **Fast Phonics** uses the proven power of systematic synthetic phonics instruction to boost reading skills. It focuses on phonemic awareness and phonics practise.

Each week you'll receive a 20-page booklet. Inside you will find a set of carefully selected activity sheets that will allow your child to revisit, consolidate and build crucial reading and literacy skills. We've packed lots in so your child can get excited for Year 2!

We recommend you follow these simple steps to get the most out of the 10-week programme.

- 1 Print the pupil pages for the week. Ensure your child has pencils and erasers to complete the worksheets.
- 2 Start by setting your child up on **Fast Phonics**. Activities begin at **Peak 15** and allow your child to progress at their own pace.
- **3** Encourage your child to read the recommended books from the **Reading Eggspress** library.
- **4** Once each day's work is complete, fill in the incentive chart. There is also a certificate at the end of the week to celebrate your child's achievement.
- **5** Enjoy the learning. Keep it light.

2	Do you ever think about what happens to all our rubbish? Some of it ends up in streams, rivers and drains.		
3	Drains lead to the sea. Plastic, cans and glass often end up in the sea and on the beach. This is not good for the planet.		
4	Plastic kills fish, birds and sea mammals. It also destroys their habitats. Birds often think bits of plastic and string are food. The plastic poisons them.		
5	Plastic litter is a problem for fish. Fish may get sick and die if they eat little plastic beads that leak into the sea.		
6	Plastic bags are a big problem. They float in the sea and look like food. If an animal eats the bag, the plastic will stay in its gut. This means that the animal will get sick and weak.		
7	Plastic is not good for sea mammals like this seal. It is tied up in plastic netting. This can hurt the seal. It might also stop the seal from getting food to eat.		
8	Litter can be a problem on the seabed too. It can destroy seaweed on the seabed. If the plants die, there will be no food for the fish and other animals to eat.		
9	What should people do to look after the fish, sea mammals and birds? How can we look after our planet better? We can start by picking up the litter we see on the sand. We can be part of a beach clean-up.		
10	A beach clean-up is one of the best ways to help keep the beach and the sea free from litter. If we pick up all the litter on the sand, it cannot get back into the sea and harm the animals. You can do a beach clean-up on a weekday, or a Saturday or Sunday. Check when the next clean-up is happening.		
11	You will need to bring the right things to clean up the beach. These people have got grabbers to pick up the litter. They each have a bag to drop the litter in. When they get rid of the litter, they can be sure it will not harm the seabirds, fish and animals.		
12	At the end of the day, you can see how much litter was on the beach. There might be buckets, fishing nets, plastic, cans and glass. It should not be left on the sand as it can get back into the sea.		
13	When we are a team, picking litter up from the sand is not a hard job. If we keep the beach clean, we can protect the habitat of birds, fish and sea mammals. When we look after the beach, we also help to look after our planet.
